

President's Message

Dear Friends,

The Asthma and Allergy Foundation, St. Louis Chapter (AAFA-STL) has provided 33 years of service to the St. Louis community and beyond and had another hallmark year in 2013. AAFA-STL continued to deepen our touch point to clients and the community with each of our major projects, including the number of prescriptions and durable goods provided for children enrolled in our flagship program, Project Concern, those served through the school nurse R.E.S.C.U.E. program, or individuals reached through our community outreach efforts. Through Project Concern, over 500 children in our service area received prescription medication assistance, durable medical equipment, education and support. An additional 4,000 people received education, training or some other form of outreach.

The R.E.S.C.U.E. (Resources for Every School Confronting Unexpected Emergencies) program had substantial reach in 2013, with 155 area schools receiving asthma equipment from AAFA-STL. Most importantly, 85% of kids who were treated for asthma emergencies in the school setting using equipment supplied by AAFA-STL were able to return to the classroom. That means these children were able to stay in school and avoid the emergency room or an unscheduled physician visit. This allowed the children to continue to learn while saving the health care system significant dollars.

Additionally, AAFA-STL's public policy and advocacy efforts continued to grow and evolve to reflect changes in the healthcare landscape and asthma care and management, and 2013 was an active year for AAFA-STL at the Missouri State Capitol as well as locally in St. Louis. It was the passage of HB 1188 a few years prior (proposed and forcefully pushed to passage by AAFA-STL) that has allowed the schools to stock and give asthma rescue medication. Our Public Policy Committee continues to strategically hone in on legislative issues that affect those we serve and those with asthma and/or allergies throughout our state.

None of this would be possible without the support and generosity from the community--including the United Way, foundations, corporations, individuals and events. As AAFA-STL was founded as a community-based nonprofit organization, we continue to serve those in our community and maintain valuable partnerships which enable us to expand our services and reach. Erika works and has insurance, but needed help in order to afford all of Eron's medicine. Since entering the program, Eron has not had

to return to the ER once. With the support from AAFA-STL, Eron is able to get all of the medications he needs to control his asthma. Erika's only lament? "I wish I knew about the program earlier!"


