Spring Allergy Capitals Report

AAFA National's 2014 Spring Allergy Capitals Report was recently released, ranking St. Louis as the 20th most difficult place to live with spring allergies (out of 100 metro areas). St. Louis ranked 31st last year. A major attributing factor to this jump is the extremely high pollen counts in our area, and we also rank worse than the national average for medicine utilization per patient. With the longer winter we experienced, there has been a delay in the tree pollen schedule, and grass pollen should be in full effect come May.

Weather is not the only thing changing in Missouri! Once again, our great "Show Me State" is leading the nation in asthma care management. Currently, we have legislation pending that will rock our great state! If all goes through the Missouri budget for 2014, healthy home assessments for high risk children who suffer from asthma will begin, as well as one-on-one telephonic follow-ups and face-to-face asthma education as soon as July of this year.

Studies around the country on the efficacy of home assessments have proven up to an 80% reduction in emergency room visits, less missed school days for children, less missed worked days for parents, decreased Medicaid costs, but most importantly, improved health of those living with asthma!



With a generous donation from an agency supporter, AAFA has expanded Project Concern to incorporate a healthy homes component, adding 12 months of asthma education and support along with inhome environmental assessments for clients. AAFA has hired a part-time Asthma Coach to fulfill this role, with the intention of providing our clients and families a more holistic approach to managing asthma and allergies inside the home.

AAFA in the National Spotlight!

Missouri, St. Louis and The Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America, St. Louis Chapter are in the national news, highlighted in a piece that was published on April 17 from Stateline, the Daily News Service of the Pew Charitable Trust ("State's Battle Asthma as Numbers Grow.") The article points out the triumph of HB 1188, in which Missouri became the first state to permit schools to stock asthma rescue medicine in addition to allowing nurses to administer the medication to students experiecing an asthma attack. It also hightlights current legislative activity in the Missouri General Assmbly concering asthma care.



Recently, the Missouri House passed an appropriations bill that would allow Medicaid reimbursement for specialists to perform home assessments of low-income patients with severe asthma. Asthma education would also be covered under the measure, which is currently in the Senate. This measure is the key policy initiative of the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America, St. Louis Chapter's 2014 Public Policy Committee. The 2014 session of Missouri General Assembly will conclude in May.
